A) Due to the cost of the costumes, this will be a much smaller cast - maximum of 30 to 35 people.

B) Minors and adults will not be cast together in "relationship" roles. In other words, no one under the age of 18 will be considered for Belle, Gaston, or the Beast.

C) There are no specific roles for young/teenage girls, however a few may be included in the ensemble.

D) We are using "younger" people for the Enchanted Objects in *Be Our Guest* (forks, knives, spoons, etc).

E) The Guest Choreographer is Peyton Royal, a professional dancer by trade. He has danced on Broadway and was the Carpet in the touring company of *Beauty and the Beast* for many years. He will hold separate dance auditions for adults (movement) and younger (actual dancing). He will be assisted by Katie Beach, a dancer/instructor in Salisbury. Be prepared to dance at the audition. Please wear appropriate footwear (no flip-flops or bare feet).

F) Please come **prepared** with a song – it's okay to have the words/music. Choose your song carefully – a show tune is best (but not from this show). Choose one that best suits your voice range and role you are auditioning for.

<u>Auditions</u> – Sunday – Tuesday, August 21-23 at Players, 5109 Nutters Cross Road, starting at 7 PM. Call backs as needed.

<u>Show Dates</u> – Friday – Sunday (4 shows) November 4-6.

Production Staff NEEDED

Props – minimum of two people to gather, assemble and run – one person for each side of the stage

Costumes – people needed to assist with costume changes and maintaining enchanted costumes (Belle will need help)

Flight Deck – at least three strong people needed

Fund Raising Help NEEDED

Someone to set up a Belle photo op or a tea party with Mrs. Potts.

Arrange to sell roses in the lobby (real or fake).

Contacting a local business to sponsor a costume – such as – The Brick Room for Gaston, ED Lighting for Lumière, Robinson's Clock for Cogsworth, Outten Brothers for Mme De La Grande Bouche, Merry Maids for Babette, a local restaurant for the utensil. If you have a connection with a local business – PLEASE ASK THEM!!! (The costumes alone are going to cost \$7000).

Disney's Beauty and the Beast Casting Descriptions

Belle - A beautiful, vibrant, intelligent girl, who wants more out of the life than an ordinary existence. She is optimistic, strong willed, caring, and eager to experience life. Female age: 25+ Vocal range: soprano

Beast/Prince - A Prince transformed into a terrifying beast for his lack of compassion. He is hot-tempered and commanding, but has a warm, loving heart buried far beneath his gruff exterior. Male age: any, Vocal range: baritone (will probably cast two different people due to costuming/make up)

Gaston - The egotistical, ultra-masculine villain determined to marry Belle. He is manipulative yet charming and funny. Male age: 30+ Vocal range baritone

Maurice - Belle's loving, eccentric father. A child at heart and inventor in his own world. Male age: 55 to 65 Vocal range: baritone

Cogsworth - A tightly-wound, enchanted mantle clock and the head of the Beast's household. He is uptight, strict, and punctual but also hard-working, faithful. Male age: 30+ Vocal range: baritone.

Mrs. Potts - A warm-hearted, maternal enchanted teapot. She is loyal, caring, and playful. Female age: 35+ Vocal range: mezzo soprano



Lumiere - A suave, debonair enchanted candelabra. He is a loyal and steadfast servant, a ladies man. Male age: 25+ Vocal range: tenor

Chip - An enchanted teacup and Mrs. Potts' darling little boy. He is innocent, playful, and bright-eyed. Male (preferably) Age: 7 to 10 Vocal range: boy soprano

Babette - A saucy, enchanted feather-duster, and the object of Lumiere's affections. She is the playful, gorgeous, seductive French maid. Female age: 25+ Vocal range: soprano

Mme De La Grande Bouche-A former opera diva-turnedenchanted wardrobe. She has a caring, refined, larger than life personality. Female age: 40 to 55 Vocal range: operatic soprano






