Synopsis

Something's Afoot is a musical spoof by Robert Gerlach that takes a satirical jab at the Agatha Christie "who dunit?" murder mysteries. Ten people are stranded in an isolated English country estate during a raging thunderstorm. One by one they are killed in mysterious (and hilarious) ways as they try to discover the murderer's identity. The situation is complicated by rising floodwaters, power failures and suspicious behaviors carefully noted by Miss Tweed, an elderly amateur detective.

- Hope Langdon "The Ingénue" age: college age Soprano
- Dr. Grayburn "The family doctor" age: over 50 Baritone
- Nigel Rancour "The black sheep nephew" age: 30-50 Tenor
- <u>Lady Grace Manley-Prowe</u> "The Grande Dame" age: 40-60 Alto
- <u>Colonel Gillweather</u> "The old army man" age: 40-60 Baritone/ Bass
- <u>Miss Tweed</u> "The tweedy, elderly amateur detective" age: over 50 Mezzo-Soprano
- <u>Geoffrey</u> "The juvenile; the uninvited guest" age: college age Tenor

We are looking for Directors for the 2017-18 season

Are you interested in directing a play? Are you not sure of all that is required to be a Director?

A potential Director will decide what play they would like to direct.

They are responsible for taking a script, a group of actors, an empty theatre, and a band of backstage people, bringing them all together and producing a fully-functional theatrical performance. The Director has the artistic vision for a play.

The Director will need to determine the approximate cost to produce the show (we have a template and people that can help you determine a budget), the dates they would like to do the show, and the availability of the show. The Director will need to have all of that information available for the Community Players Production Committee.

Once a show is selected by the Community Players Board of Directors, the Director will hold auditions to select the cast members. They will also select the stage manager and the technical crew (lighting, sound, costume designer, and set designer). On larger productions, there may be other supporting staff such as a producer, a choreographer, and a music director.

First and foremost, the Director is a leader. They direct the actors, offering guidance on character interpretation and dictating the subtlety of their performance. They also offer guidance and direction to the technical crew. Directors determine the final pacing of the play as it comes to life on the stage. Once the show opens, the director's work is essentially complete.
