

President Megan Davis has announced that the next regularly scheduled meeting will be Wednesday, March 1 at 7 PM at Players on Nutters Cross Road..



- CPOS: Who are you when you are not a Community Player?
- PETE: Father to two amazing girls, Husband, guitar player and doctor.
- CPOS: How long have you been a Players' member?
- PETE: I have been in CPOS since 2013.
- CPOS: What was the first Players' show you were involved with? In what capacity?
- PETE: I started in Les Mis after many years working with The Salisbury School's productions.
- CPOS: What is your all-time favorite play or musical?
- PETE: My all time favorite show recently became 'Hamilton' I can't stop listening to the sound track!
- CPOS: What is your ultimate dream role?
- PETE: Either The Leading Player from 'Pippin' or George Washington from 'Hamilton' although I am afraid I might be a tad short for that one!
- CPOS: Where do you see Players in 10 years?
- PETE: Community Players is a living and growing thing. New people come and many stay. All have something to offer. So as we progress, I'd like to see more opportunities for everyone to do what they love. More acting, directing, building, etc. Creativity is rife in the organization and that is something on which we all thrive! In ten years, I'd like to see performance space at Nutters and more shows in a season. I'd like find ways to encourage more people from our community to participate. Personally, I'd also like to direct again — DeathTrap is a blast!





Community Players' Member Spotlight on Kenny Johnson

CPOS: Who are you when you are not a Community Player?

- KENNY: I am a 9th grade earth Science teacher at Wi Hi and a single parent of 5 wonderful children. (Guess I really can't call them children anymore since the youngest is 24 (gasp!) and the oldest is 36.
- CPOS: How long have you been a Players' member?
- KENNY: I was just a sophomore in High School. I actually did more work with Masque Dinner Theatre which was another Theatre Group in Salisbury at the time with quite a bit of overlap in people between the two organizations.

CPOS: What was the first Players' show you were involved with? In what capacity?

KENNY: I began my Players career (officially) back in 1982 when I ran the follow spot for 'Don't Drink The Water". I did also get to run the light board whenever Mike Taylor fell asleep during the show – much to the dismay of Director Janet Pfeiffer.

CPOS: What is your all-time favorite play or musical?

- KENNY: That is such a tough question since I like a lot of them. But Wizard of Oz has got to be at the top. I got to be involved all three times that Players did this musical – Twice as the Scarecrow (with a 17 year break in between) and then directing it in 2011.
- CPOS: What is your ultimate dream role?
- KENNY: I've been able to play several of my dream roles Scarecrow, Finch in 'How to Succeed" and Bert in Mary Poppins. My new dream roles however are Ms. Trunchbull in "Matilda" and the entire D'Ysquith Family in "A Gentleman's Guide to Love and Murder".

CPOS: Where do you see Players in 10 years?

KENNY: I would LOVE to see Players expand their outreach to the youth of our community. It would be a beautiful thing for Players to be producing at least one show a summer completely cast, created, constructed, and performed with High School and Middle School students.



Arsenic and Old Lace Auditions set for April 2, 3 & 4

Director Rusty Mumford has set auditions for the final show of this season, *Arsenic and Old Lace*, for April 2 (2 PM), April 3 and 4 (7 PM). All auditions will be held at Players on Nutters Cross Road.

The cast includes 3 women and 11 men. Ages of the characters, especially the men will depend on those who audition with the youngest being mid-twenties.

Community Players' Board Member Spotlight on Kel Nagel

CPOS: Who are you when you are not a Community Player?

- KEL: I am a retired physician, having practiced Pulmonary/Critical Care medicine at PRMC from 1978 to 2014. I am still a father of three and grandfather of three, and have more time to do that now that I am retired. I am also involved with Friends of Delmarva Public Radio.
- CPOS: How long have you been a Players' member?

KEL: Since fall of 1996.

CPOS: What was the first Players' show you were involved with? In what capacity?

KEL: I was in the 1996 production of Guys and Dolls. Director Chris Harris created the role of Big Jules's bodyguard for me and gave me some funny physical bits to do with Big Jule (Bob Connolly) and Nathan Detroit (Chris Barnes). No lines, though. Since then I have been in over twenty shows and directed six. Debby and I are currently helping out with set decoration and props for Deathtrap.

CPOS: What is your all-time favorite play or musical?

- KEL: I have so many, but probably Oklahoma, which I regard as the quintessential American musical.
- CPOS: What is your ultimate dream role?
- KEL: If I were younger, thinner, and could sing better, it would be Curly from Oklahoma. Right now my dream role is to direct a musical.
- CPOS: Where do you see Players in 10 years?
- KEL: It seems that in every newsletter the spotlighted people say that they want us to have our own theater. Me too! It looks as though we may be able to start planning soon. It will be a tremendous project and will require a lot of work from members and community support. I hope to be around to see it get done.




