#### A GOOD AUDITION SONG

- **Be less than two minutes.** Two minutes is more than enough to show your stuff. You don't want the casting crew to start wondering if this is ever going to end. The director may cut you off don't take it personally. If you choose a longer song, choose to sing the section that shows your range.
- Have a clear objective. You can't just stand there and sing. You have to be actively "talking" to someone you've imagined, and you must be trying to get something from them. That's true even if you are having an inner dialogue.
- Think of the character. If you are auditioning for a specific role, choose a song that reflects that character. Let the director be able to see you in that part. If you do not have a specific role in mind, then think of the musical; its theme and tone.
- Age Appropriate. If you are 15, don't sing "I Miss the Mountains" or "Ladies Who Lunch". Don't sing about your years of surviving a faithless marriage or nights spent at the bar drowning your sorrows.
- **If possible, memorize.** No one wants to watch an actor staring at their phone or a piece of paper instead of making eye contact at the people in the audition room.
- **Enjoy the experience!** I've never seen anyone die at an audition. Believe it or not, most of the actors in the room are rooting for you to do a good job. Remember too, there is a fine line in choosing a song we all love to hear and one that the casting crew has heard a few hundred times too many.

#### THEATRE TEASERS

Trivia by Sharon Benchoff (This month's topic-Notable people of color in Theatre)



- 1. Lorraine V. Hansberry was the first African-American female author to have a play performed on Broadway in 1959. Name this well-known play (that was turned into an award-winning film)
- 2. Who was the first black to play Othello?
- 3. Morgan Freeman, Brock Peters and James Earl Jones all portrayed Hoke Coleburn in this play that takes place in Atlanta.
- 4. Juanita Hall, who played Bloody Mary in the original 1949 production of this musical, was the first African-American performer to win a Tony Award.
- 5. This beloved actor has performed on Broadway in Pippin, Jesus Christ Superstar and Fosse.
- 6. The Broadway Theater located at 245 W 52nd St, New York, NY is named for this prolific playwright.
- 7. She is the first actress to win six Tony Awards.
- 8. Madea is a character that appears in several plays written by this playwright, actor and producer.
- 9. Daveed Diggs, Renee Elise Goldsberry, Leslie Odom, Jr. and Okieriete Onaodowan were all cast members of this groundbreaking musical.
- 10. This was the first (1921) full-fledged Broadway musical with an all-black cast, playwright, composer and lyricist. Revival in 2016.
- 11. For his leading turn in The Great White Hope, this actor was awarded Best Actor in a Play at the 1969 Tony Awards, the first African-American winner in any play category.

#### A GOOD MONOLOGUE

- Be less than two minutes. Two minutes is more than enough to show your stuff. You don't want the casting crew to start wondering if this is ever going to end.
- Have a clear objective. You can't just stand there and talk. You have to be actively talking to someone you've imagined, and you must be trying to get something from them. That's true even if you are having an inner dialogue.
- Have a distinct beginning, middle, and end. A beginning: A strong sentence to grab attention. A middle: Content. Build the middle featuring a climax, revelation or turning point. An end: A strong finish. Instead of ranting or shouting for the entire piece, have some variation. When your monologue has structure, you are more likely to be remembered.
- Contain conflict. Drama or Comedy cannot exist without conflict. Who wants to see a play about everyone getting along and not having any bumps in the road of their life? Boring...
- Think of the character. If you are auditioning for a specific role, choose a monologue that reflects that character. Let the director be able to see you in that part. If you do not have a specific role in mind, then think of the play; its theme and tone.
- Age Appropriate. If you are 15, don't tell us about your years of surviving a faithless marriage, nights spent at the bar drowning your sorrows or ungrateful adult children.
- If possible, memorize. No one wants to watch an actor staring at their phone or a piece of paper instead of making eye contact with the people in the audition room.
