#### **GRANTS**

Hello, all. This is Jerry Gietka. A short time ago, I asked a question about the grants committee. Little did I know. Now, I find that I AM the grants committee. No worries, as I have done this before. I have managed grants as part of my professional life. I have secured grants as part of my volunteer life.

This missive attempts to fulfill three purposes. First, to introduce myself and my creds for doing this. Secondly, to recruit some person(s) to join with me. I commit to this function for one year ONLY. I will serve ONLY until the next BOD elections, June 2023. I hope to find someone interested enough to learn ALL (???) that I know about grants and train them. Third, I am also attempting to find out what and how much I might request grants.

My creds: as I say, I have done this before. My goal for this year is to bring in grant money equal to @ \$20,000. Based on what I have done in the past, I believe that is a reasonable goal. Stats from various theater support groups show that a large percentage of community theater companies depend on grants for 1/3 of their income. CPOS is fortunate in that this is not the case. All that I know: I will follow this article up with another next month in that regard. Finally, I am asking each of the members to give me some ideas.

Often, grant making organizations require specific detail as to what is being asked of them. You want how much to do what? Some examples for applying for grants: \$10,000 for new lighting equipment and why this is needed; \$5,000 for new sound equipment, likewise; \$2,000 for software to track and control inventory (costumes, props, set pieces etc).

You know what you need and want. You know the approximate costs. You need to tell me. I look forward to hearing from you, both your wants and your needs. Please specify which. My contact info is jerrygietk@hotmail.com.

#### The Musical

Auditions will take place on Sunday, August 21 at 3:00 pm and Monday, August 22 at 6:30 pm. Callbacks, if needed, will take place on Tuesday, August 23 at 6:30 pm. Those auditioning should prepare a song of no more than 3 minutes from a Broadway or Off-Broadway musical. The production team prefers that those auditioning bring a backing track as their accompaniment. If that is not possible, an accompanist will be available. No acapella auditions will be permitted.

#### Character Breakdown

\*Jo March - the story's protagonist. She is passionate, adventurous and brave. She ultimately has the idea of writing the story "Little Women." She is the Civil-War era version of a feminist. Female, 18 to 23, A5 to E3

\*Meg March - The world-weary, yet hopeful, oldest sister who yearns for a great life. She marries John and has twins with him. Female, 21 to 25, Gb5 to

\*Beth March - The second youngest sister who tragically dies of Scarlet Fever. Peace-maker, lover, and an optimist who is always encouraging her sisters to dream. Female, 17 to 21, G5 to A3

\*Amy March - The youngest, most energetic sister with a rather pompous air

about her. She later marries Laurie. Female, 14 to 18, Gb5 to -1

\*Marmee March - The girls' mother. She is the strong backbone of the family, who is courageous in spite of the difficult odds she faces. Female, 45 to 55, Eb5 to Eb3

\*Laurie Laurence - The bright-eyed boy-next-door with considerable charm.

He loves Jo but later falls in love with Amy. Male, 18 to 23, Bb4 to Bb2

\*Mr. Laurence - Laurie's stern grandfather. He initially is not supportive of Laurie's relationship with the March sisters but ultimately warms up to the March family, especially Beth. Male, 65-75, Baritone in general.

\*Aunt March - A formidable, over-bearing matron and great-aunt to the

March sisters. The wealthy socialite in town. Female, 45 to 60, F5 to E3

\*Mr. John Brooke - Laurie's tutor and a rather stiff man; shows very little emotion. He later marries Meg and changes. Male, 30 to 40, F#4 to C#3

\*Professor Bhaer - German Professor who exemplifies proper manners. He is a boarder in Mrs. Kirk's boarding house and eventually falls in love with Jo. Male, 35 to 45, F#4 to G2

\*Mrs. Kirk - Runs the New York Boarding House where Jo lives when she moves to New York. Kind but in charge. Female, 45-55, Range: Not specified.






#### **ED DUVALL**
